Let's get to know flora of Elblag Upland Landscape Park

The area of Elblag Upland Landscape Park is characterized by a diversity of plants, which is connected not only with various forms of land relief but diversity of natural habitats as well. The area of the park is covered with deciduous forests growing in various natural habitats with many species of trees and bushes such as: ash trees, maples, hornbeams, alders, Douglas firs. There are lots of plant species typical of mountain and foothill areas that can be found in the park area for example a spurge laurel, a common buckthorn and a common yew.

The pupils of the 5th grade getting to know the species of park plants made herbaria of the plants, bushes and trees typical of this area. In this way the students could recognize the plants by leaves, flowers. The herbaria will be presented on a special exhibition "Flora of the Elblag Upland Landscape Park.
